

### Healthy Eating Workshops

Thank you to Mrs Crabtree for organising with Mr Knight our Co-op Healthy Eating workshops. The Coop completely funded this project and gave the pupils goodie bags.

The aim was for the children to work collaboratively in small groups, to plan, then buy and serve a healthy lunch, with £5.

Activities included discussions about portion size, likes and dislikes, special offers and compromise making meals for the benefit of all, which meant some pupils trying new things to eat.
