Behaviour policy

We are currently reviewing our behaviour policy and this is being re written by the pupils.

Our 'Good to be Green' scheme is a positive reward scheme based on making good choices. It fits very much within our aim of teaching children learning for life skills. **Please see poster in all classrooms**
Consequences are in place for when pupils do not follow school rules and interrupt other pupils learning or physically hurt others. Our aim is always to teach self-discipline and encourage children to think

about the consequences of their actions and what they could do differently next time. The police tell us that education, especially around retaliation in Primary school, does help to reduce unacceptable behaviour later in life, which can lead to more serious consequences than a red card and think slip. Thank you for your support in our education of this very important life skill in a time of lack of tolerance and impatience in society.
