Smoking Prevention and Medicine Safety workshops

As part of our Healthy Schools work, helping pupils to keep themselves safe, our Year 6 pupils have completed some workshops on Smoking Prevention and Y3/4 pupils on Medicine safety.

Isaac, "Smoking causes bad lungs. I now know tobacco is a leaf." Ben agreed, "chemicals are inside cigarettes and they are bad for you damaging the lungs."

Molly and Maya said, "we learnt what was inside cigarettes and learnt what they do to our bodies. So we know it can hurt us and can cause permanent damage."

Jayden said, "some tablets look like sweets, I must ask an adult before taking anything."

Megan," you must never take any medicine, if it doesn't have your name on it."

"We learnt that poo has germs in it and we know people have to pick it up safely," says Brennan.

Aysha says, "we must never touch medicines or get them out of a cupboard. We always must ask an adult first."
